Davis & Corbett (1994) Russian has light and dark blue





Another way of parsing time

"Using spatial concepts to talk and think about time may be a universal characteristic of the human mind" (Sinha 2011)



abstract notion of Time

Amondawa (indigenous people of Rondônia)

- only four number words
- time (day) marked
 - by sun's position
 - activity (rising, eating, working)
- no abstract notion of "time" (tempo translated kuara, sun)
- they talk about movement of kuara
- but not about dry season "approaching"
- do not recognise birthdays, but name "life stages"

The Story of Captain William Kidd

ca 1645	born in Dundee, Scotland					
1680 on	worked on various buccaneer crews (waters around Central America)					
1695	received financial backing from Lord Belmont (Boston) to become a privateer					
1698	captured an Armenian vessel in the Indian ocean sailing with French passes, part owned by Indian courtier					
1701	flight to Boston dropped by his erstwhile backer transported to London tried and executed as a pirate decaying body displayed at Wapping on the Thames to discourage pirates

Mariners with Violent Tendencies

Pirate general term for illegal, violent robbery

involving boats (from Greek peiratēs,

meaning brigand)

Buccaneer active around the Caribbean, French

and British, targeting Spanish ships

Corsair active around North Africa, the Barbary coast,

often but not only targeting Muslim vessels,

privateer status

Privateer privately owned, armed ships

official permissions to plunder ships of enemy states

"private" extension of the navy



Foreign Commentary on Elections



Polls are set to open in 48 hours across as the authoritarian regime of attempts to consolidate its hold over the troubled, oil-rich, [...] nation. Analysts are sceptical the election will end months of political violence.

Viral images captured by journalists who have ventured deep into the interior of the troubled show deserted streets taken over by politically-aligned militia riding in "technicals" just a day before the country's presidential election.

official denies reports that the country has told its citizens in to "get out while you can", says the military is developing plans for an orderly evacuation should the political situation in the crisis-wracked [...] nation deteriorate further.

Analysts warn that the fear and desperation created by the deepening humanitarian crisis, coupled with one of the most tribalized election campaigns in its history, may lift the lid off dangerous ancient ethnic hatreds and grievances that have festered for centuries.


