

Germany: Annalena Baerbock becomes prime target of sexist hate speech

Threats against politicians have sharply risen ahead of September's general elections. The leading candidate to replace Angela Merkel has rapidly become the prime target for misogyny, vitriol, and fake news.

It's been barely three weeks since Annalena Baerbock was nominated as the Green party's chancellor candidate. But it took only a matter of hours after her nomination on April 19 for disinformation and hate about her to begin spreading like wildfire online.

Green party election campaign leader Michael Kellner says the hate and fake reports have taken on a "completely new dimension."

Experts warn that the wave of targeted hate and disinformation that has spread about Baerbock is only the tip of the iceberg ahead of September's general election.

'group'

shares systems of beliefs

social representations

- has shared beliefs with other groups in a society
 - common ground
- selects norms and values to organise itself freedom, equality, justice, market
- discourse practices construct the group

(paraphrased from van Dijk 2000)

Ideology, the second "new" term



'ideology'


- has a 'canonical structure', facilitating dissemination and adoption
- relies on a 'knowledge' based on the shared beliefs
- can determine practices through norms, aims and values
- regulates access to valued 'commodities'
 e.g. group membership, activities, power
- defines identity





So, don't go near the Seghill mine Across the way they'll stretch a line, To catch the throat and break the spine Of the dirty blackleg miner.


They grab his duds and his pick as well And they hoy them down the pit of hell. Down you go, and fare you well, You dirty blackleg miner.



Constructions of 'them': Rwanda







What to do...



- be aware of linguistic and semiotic (mis-)representations
- analyse what political discourse practices say
 and what they don't say
- spot the beliefs / 'knowledge' in ideologies
- question
 - (simplistic) narratives
 - (dubious) analogies and images
 - and (stereotypical) characterisations
 - unreferenced figures and statistics
- resist 'realities' of Normalisation
- activate your











When and if fascism comes to America it will not be labelled "made in Germany"; it will not be marked with a swastika; it will not even be called fascism; it will be called, of course, "Americanism." [...]

The high-sounding phrase "the American way" will be used by interested groups intent on profit, to cover a multitude of sins against the American and Christian tradition, such sins as lawless violence, teargas and shotguns, denial of civil liberties. [...]

For never, probably, has there been a time when there was a more vigorous effort to surround social and international questions with such a fog of distortion and prejudices and hysterical appeal to fear. We have touched a new low in a Congressional investigation this summer, used by some participating in it to whip up fear and prejudice against many causes of human welfare, such as concern for peace and the rights of labour to bargain collectively.
