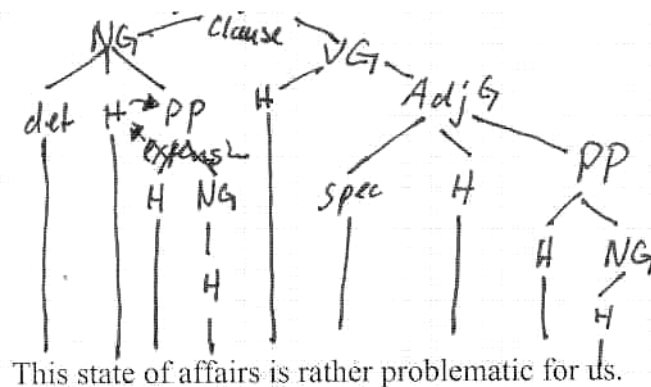
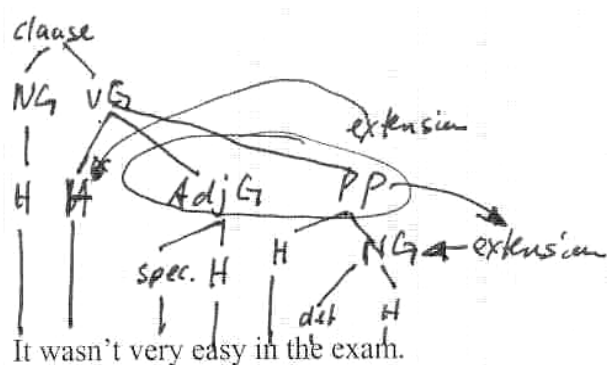
**Practice Run 2** Break the following clauses up into **Groups**. Then identify **Heads**, **Specifiers** and **Extensions** (where there any).



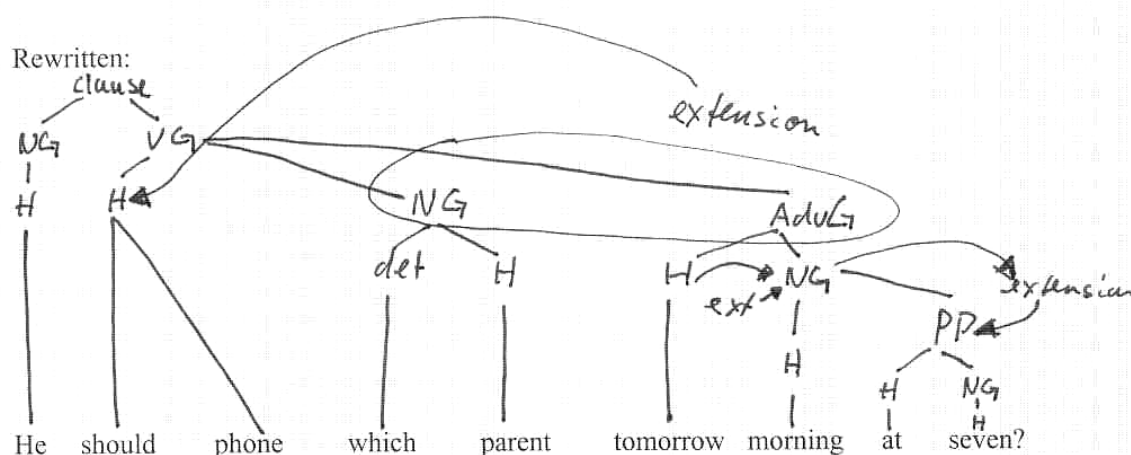
The obviously deranged man went on a run through the supermarket.
